



Vanita Krouch is a veteran Quarterback for the U.S. Women's National Team and is recognized as the "Tom Brady of Flag Football." She joined the U.S. National Team in 2016 and was inducted into the National Flag and Touch Football Hall Fame that same year. Since then, Vanita earned 4 IFAF Medals, a Silver medal at the 2022 World Games, starred in a Super Bowl commercial, coached as the offensive coordinator for the 2023 NFC Pro Bowl team, started her own philanthropy, and is currently training for the 2028 Olympics where Flag Football will make its debut.

Saaid Mortazavi is the Head Coach of USA Football's Women's Flag National Team. Prior to joining the U.S. Women's National Team in 2023, Mortazavi served as assistant coach of the Panamanian Men's National Team in 2021 and head coach in 2022. In 2021, he helped lead the Panamanian team to a bronze medal finish at the IFAF World Championships in Israel.





Madison Fulford, Wide Receiver, began playing flag football in an intramural league while serving in the U.S. Air Force as a mental health counselor. A year later she joined the U.S. Women's National Team in 2023. As a decorated collegiate track and field athlete, Fulford won conference championships in the javelin, indoor high jump and 4x100 relay at Division II Limestone University in Gaffney, S.C. Fulford is owner of Mad Skills Training, providing inclusive flag football training opportunities for girls of all ages.

Laneah Bryan, Defensive Back has been playing flag football for 6 years, first joining the U.S. Women's National Team in 2023 helping the team to a gold-medal winning performance in the IFAF Americas Continental Championship over Mexico. Bryan helped the U.S. to a perfect 6-0 record, tallying seven interceptions, including one in the gold medal match. Bryan attended the University of New Mexico with a basketball scholarship, playing four seasons (2014-18) for the Lobos and seeing action in 121 career games. She is the co-owner of MountainStar Solar and G.O.A.T. Roofing and Construction in El Paso.
